The Cancer Research Centre (CRC) is situated at the junction of London Road and Daulby Street, adjacent to the Royal Liverpool University Hospital, just minutes from Liverpool City Centre. The entrance is on Daulby Street.

Travel Information

Rail

Liverpool is well-served by the West Coast Mainline with trains running in to Lime Street Station at frequent intervals - see www.nationalrail.co.uk for information and timetables.

There are several taxi ranks immediately outside the station, and the journey to the CRC takes around 5 mins (approx. £5) – note that the CRC is known locally as *'the Roy Castle building'*.

To go by foot (10 mins), take the exit at the far right of the station concourse and turn right into Lord Nelson Street. Take the first left along Pudsey Street and then turn right onto London Road. Continue straight on for approximately 650 metres, keeping to the left through the pedestrianised area; the CRC is on the right at the junction of London Road and Daulby Street. Coach

The National Express coach station (www.nationalexpress.com) is less than a ten-minute walk from the Cancer Research Centre. Turn right from the station exit and at the junction turn left up London Road. Continue straight on for approximately 450 metres, keeping to the left through the pedestrianised area; the CRC is on the right at the junction of London Road and Daulby Street. Bus

A wide range of buses serve the CRC. For comprehensive local travel information call TraveLine on 0871 2002233 or use the journey planner at www.traveline-northwest.co.uk.

Car

At the end of the M62, continue straight ahead onto Edge Lane (A5080 then A5047) and follow signs for Liverpool City Centre and the Royal Liverpool University Hospital. The CRC is adjacent to the Royal Liverpool, on the corner of London Road and Daulby Street.

There is no visitor parking at the CRC, but the multi-storey Q-Park pay and display facility located on Epworth Street (accessed via Islington/Erskine Street) is a two-minute walk away. The car park postcode for SatNav purposes is L6 1LY and pricing information is available on the Q-Park website www.q-park.co.uk/parking/liverpool.q-park-royal-liverpool.

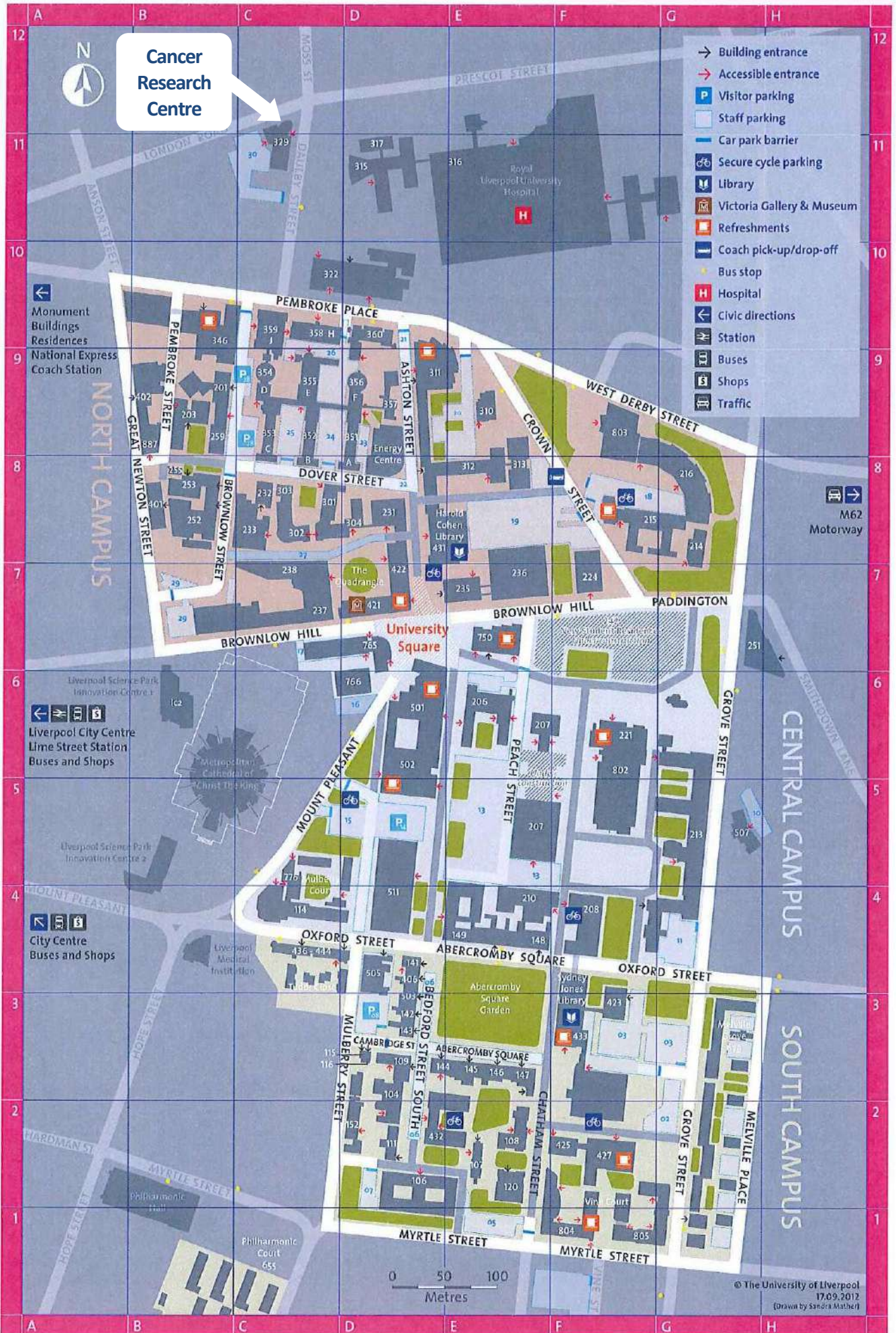
To reach the CRC from Q-Park, turn left onto Epworth Street and then right onto Prescott Street. Continue down the hill to the Daulby Street junction; the CRC is on the left hand corner. A direction map can be found here: <https://goo.gl/maps/RWpNtBnNxC12>.

Accommodation
