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## Guidelines for setting up a Special Interest Forum

- 1. Any proposal to set up a Special Interest Forum (SIF) must be supported in writing by at least 10 APM members who will contribute to the business of the Forum.
- 2. The proposal must have a clearly stated aim which is agreed with the APM Council. At the time of approval, the reporting route to the APM Council will be decided.
- 3. Once the proposal has been approved, a general invitation to join the SIF must be issued to all APM members. The APM Secretariat will assist in this.
- 4. The APM Secretariat will assist in setting up a page on the APM website specifically for the SIF, which the SIF must provide content for. Thereafter, the SIF will need to provide the Secretariat with content no less than ½ yearly to refresh the webpage. Views expressed on the webpage must be lawful and compatible with the objectives of the APM.
- 5. Each SIF should have an elected coordinator, who must be an APM member, reviewed on a three year cycle. The coordinator will be required to provide a brief update twice a year for the APM Council and an annual report to the APM Secretariat for the AGM.
- 6. SIFs do not speak on behalf of the APM but the SIF coordinator may wish to present proposals, documents, etc. to the APM Board to develop ideas from the SIF.
- 7. SIFs may be open to non-APM members who are considered by the coordinator to have a legitimate interest; however those who are eligible for APM membership should be encouraged to join the APM.
- 8. The SIF membership list will be maintained by the SIF coordinator and must ensure a GDPR compliant database is created, along with work contact details.
- 9. There is no funding available for any face to face meetings.
- 10. Each SIF will be required to contribute to the APM bulletin on a rotational basis, providing an update about some of the issues that are arising or highlighting areas of clinical, educational or research interest.
- 11. Each SIF will be reviewed on an annual basis by the APM Council. Those which are no longer active; do not contribute to the website/bulletin and/or which contravene the objectives of the APM may have its provision withdrawn.
